Technology Copilots are students who have been trained to provide assistance with using the Crestron Mercury X systems, Zoom, and iClicker,



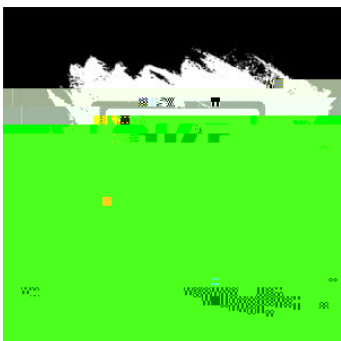
ensuring that remote students have a voice in physical classrooms. Self-paced training is available for instructors, TAs, and others who assist faculty.

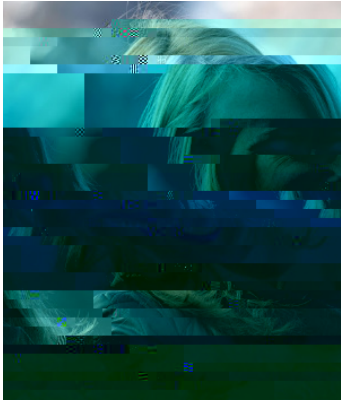

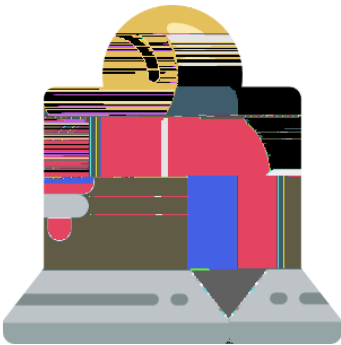
